Did You Know...?

RESULTS OF PARKING SURVEY

The following is a brief summary of the results of the recent parking survey; a detailed tabulation of results is on the door of the 6th floor lounge.

There were 192 responders to the survey, of whom 28% were MS I, 34% were MS II, 31% were MS III, and 8% were MS IV. A significant 19% of those responding ride a bike to campus, while 33% of those who do not presently bike would bike if appropriate paths were created. 66% of those responding drive compact cars, while 80% of responders would be in favor of compact car zones in H lots. 77% of those responding favor creation of a student lot in the Anderson St. area, and 26% of responders would be willing to pay \$50/year to park in Parking Garage II (beside VA). The average rating of the present parking situation was 8.1 (1= no problem; 10= severe problem).

Thank you for having taken the time to respond to this survey, and thus to help define and document the present parking problems. The Medical Center Parking Commission is aware of the survey results, and several possible solutions are being actively considered.

Summary of Parking Rules Relevant to H Decals

Zone parking restrictions (i.e., regulations restricting H decal holders to only H decal areas) are in effect 7:30 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. Monday through Friday only, with the following exceptions: 1 - HS areas, service vehicle areas on Service Drive, Handicapped, and any spaces marked "Reserved" or "24 hour tow" are off limits to H decals 24 hours/day, 7 days/week. 2 - The upper Allen portion of the Zone A Allen lots is off limits 7:30 a.m. through 12:00 noon on Saturday as well as 7:30 a.m. through 4:00 p.m. Monday through Friday.

Outside of the restricted hours and permanently restricted areas, anyone with an H decal can park in any of the other zones, including the Allen lots, the gated lots on Flowers Drive and the gated lots beside MSIA.

Both male and female students with H decals can park in Parking Garage I (in front of Duke Hospital) free after 6:00 p.m. on weekdays and after 2:00 p.m. on Saturday and Sunday. Both male and female students with H decals can also park in Parking Garage II (beside VA Hospital) free after 2:00 p.m., 7 days a week.

There is now a bus traveling from Parking Garage II to Duke Hospital main entrance every 15 minutes from 7:00 a.m. until 6:00 p.m., Monday through Friday. The weekend hours for the Parking Garages are being reviewed with the possibility of expansion of hours in the future.

Anyone leaving the hospital at night may obtain transportation to his/her car by a security escort by calling 684-2444. In the past there have been complaints about excessive delays when using this service, but hopefully these are now corrected. Anyone who has to wait more than 15 minutes (by the clock) for the escort, PLEASE send me a note at Box 2782, giving time, date, and circumstances.

In response to inquiries, please note that the undeveloped land on Anderson St. between Erwin Road and the railroad tracks is owned by a private realty company, and thus is not subject to upkeep by Duke.

These scholarships are for the academic year 1979-80. Maximum awards are \$4,000/year for 4 years. A candidate is required to have been a legal resident of New York

State for 1 year prior to September 1, 1979; be enrolled in medical school or must be a candidate for admission or readmission to medical school; agree to practice medicine, for a period of at least 9 months for each annual grant received in an area in New York State designated as having a shortage of physicians; submit an application postmarked not later than May 1, 1979. 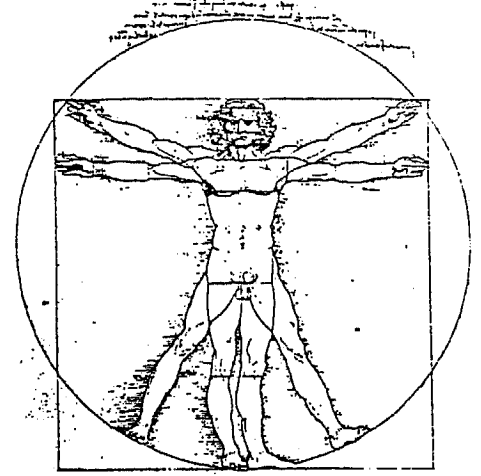
