- Major budget decreases
- 50% reduction in FTE
- 60% decrease in revenues
- Space reduced by 16,000 sq. ft.
 - Another 3,000 feet this year
 - By 2013 12,000 less
- Hospital, health system, academic, research library

- Outsource cataloging processing
- Streamline in-house processing
- Simplify approach to cataloging
- Leverage automated systems
- Reduce Staff





Internal Collaboration

- Communicating everything
- Bringing together the life cycle
- Asking why? Instead of how
- Setting priorities for workflow
- Creating backup, cross training
- Using retired staff as consultants
- Partnering with other libraries







Collection Services

- Implementing data-driven selection
 - Patron driven -- by actual usage
 - Patron requests vs. librarian assessment
- Breaking myths
- Using technology for team-based decisions
 - Online approval plan; profile selection
 - Prior purchasing patterns
- Tracking use
- Trying e-books for a year





- Expanding consortia purchases
- Implementing vendor e-journal list
 - Moving from home-grown database
- Implementing open-source ERM
 - CORAL
- Trying new titles for a year
- Eliminating print whenever feasible
 - Fewer than 80 print titles
 - No longer keep or bind duplicate print





Service Desk

- Streamlining desk and functions
- Reducing evening/weekend staff
- Expanding hours with a security guard
- Implementing self check-out
- Using staff for other processing





- Regular review of all vendors
- Shared storage
 - Single copy storage campus, TRLN
 - Clearing stack space
 - Desk-top delivery
- Metadata projects CME portal
