PROGRAMMED INSTRUCTION

We are hopeful programmed instruction will become a popular element of our educational program. This year four "teaching machines" will be available at a convenient location in the Scientific Exhibits area. These machines offer an excellent opportunity to review medical information in several basic topics. Each course completed qualifies for two hours prescribed Academy credit. Each of the courses takes an hour or more to complete, depending upon familiarity with the topic. Each topic is covered in detail. A choice of answers to various questions regarding physiology, diagnosis and treatment is given. The physician's assistant presses a button to select an answer to the question shown on the machine. If the answer is incorrect, the machine displays additional information to strengthen knowledge in that area. If the answer is correct the machine continues with the main program.
