MEDICAL AND DENTAL CAREER FUND

The Medical and Dental Career Fund announces that it has financial aid available through a California Bank to assist you in completing your training. To qualify, for Interns, you must be within 3 years of completing your training, and for Residents, you must be completing your Residency training and going into practice within 3 years. No repayment will be required for 6 months after you have completed your training. The only immediate payment that will be required will be \$25 per month credited to interest. This amount will be paid until you have completed your training, and been in practice for 6 months. Then arrangements will be made to pay the balance of the loan over a period up to 36 months with no penalty for pre-payment. Funds are available from \$2,500 to \$10,000 depending upon your remaining time in training. 
