The topic of Dr. Ingelfinger's presentation is:

"Medical Literature: The Campus Without Tumult" The presentation will be held in the Hospital Amphitheater from 5-6 P.M. on April 9, 1970. There will be a coffee-tea reception in the Hospital Cafeteria from 4:30 - 5:00 P.M. on the 9th in honor of our guest speaker. All faculty and students are cordially invited to attend.

A RATIONAL APPROACH TO PHARMACOLOGY: An ad hoc committee is being formed to work in the following areas:

- The establishment of a course in clinical pharmacology to deal with (1) the types of drugs physicians most often prescribe. The cost of drugs to the patient, generic versus brand name drugs, and misleading pharmaceutical advertising are topics which will be considered.
- (2) The feasability that generic names be used on all prescriptions written in Duke Medical Center.
- (3) A change in form of the routine prescription blank so that all bottles will be labeled with the name of the drug unless the individual physician specifies otherwise.
