MELLON FELLOWSHIP PROGRAM IN PSYCHIATRY FOR MEDICAL STUDENTS

This will involve completion of a research project or the enhancement of particular clinical skills in close collaboration with a faculty member. The award consists of a stipend of \$1,000 plus travel expenses. The student may select any eight week block between January 15, 1976 and June 30, 1976.
