

ORGANIZATION OF STUDENT REPRESENTATIVES

DAVISON SCHOLARSHIP FOR STUDY ABROAD

The Davison Scholarship for Study Abroad is being announced by Dr. Shirley Oster-This scholarship is worth \$1000 and is awarded to a student with an approved study-away program in Clinical Medicine, preferably related to Primary Care. program is reviewed by the Scholarship Committee and will be announced March 1. The deadline for application is January 15, 1978. Applications are available in the Office of Medical Education.

UNDERGRADUATE SCHOLARSHIP AWARD FOR STUDY IN SURGERY

The International College of Surgeons has established an Undergraduate Scholarship Award for the education of students of medicine who seek a career in the field of surgery. The Awards enable qualified third year medical students to broaden their knowledge of the surgical arts through study at a medical school, hospital or clinic outside the United States. The Awards consist of cash grants to cover living expenses for a period of supervised study of approximately three months duration to be completed between the applicants' 3rd and 4th years of med school. ANALYSIS OF HEALTH ISSUES

Project HOPE is offering two \$1000 prizes for analytical papers on the long-range consequences which might be expected to result from a nationwide hospital cost containment program. Entries are due by December 31, 1977, and must not exceed 5000 words. Papers will be judged on the quality of the analysis, clarity of presentation, and originality.
