Information on the following programs is available for review in the Medical School Library Reserve Room, in a book entitled Electives Away from Duke.


The National Institute of Environmental Health Sciences, Research Triangle Park, N.C., plans to offer summer employment to a limited number of graduate students. Positions will be at the GS-5 level, at a salary of \$4.79/hr. or at the GS-7 level (completion of 1 full year of graduate studies or more) at a salary of \$5.93/hr. Persons interested may apply by submission of a standard form 171 personal qualifications statement and a CSC form 226-list of college courses to the Personnel Office, National Institute of Environmental Health Sciences, P.O. Box 12233, Research Triangle Park, N.C. 27709. Applications must be received by April 15, 1978. Application forms available from Duke Placement Office.

The American Heart Association has established a three month traineeship in cerebrovascular disease at the Mayo Clinic and Mayo Medical School for a fourth year medical student. The traineeship is for 3 months any time from January to December, 1978, and carries a \$1,500 award. The trainee will receive in-depth exposure to the diagnosis, management and pathogenesis of cerebrovascular disease. Upon completion of the traineeship, the student would be required to send a summary letter to the Stroke Council and would then receive a complimentary subscription to the magazine, "Stroke". The <u>University of Florida</u>, offers an externship in <u>radiation onćology</u> to 2nd, 3rd, and 4th year medical students. The program aims to provide students with an intimate exposure to the examination, diagnosis, and treatment of the cancer patient. Emphasis is on a multidisciplinary approach to cancer management.
