### Cigarette sales banned at DUMC

Effective April 1, 1987, the sale of cigarettes and other tobacco products will be banned in all DUMC buildings. The new policy was approved at the December 8 meeting of the Duke University Hospital Advisory Committee and at the December 10 meeting of the medical school faculty. A similar proposal was passed by the Davison Council at its November 27 meeting.

No other major changes in smoking policy within the medical center are planned at this time. The Davison Council expresses its gratitude for student input on this issue.

Dear Doctor Anlyan:

Due to circumstances beyond my control I find it impossible to continue as Dean of Undergraduate Medical Education at the Duke University School of Medicine. As you are already aware, I shall assume full-time responsibilities in my home department of Obstetrics and Gynecology as of January 5, 1987.

The past eight years have been gratifying ones during which I had the pleasure of interacting with some of the brightest young people in medicine in the country. I have found our students to be exceptionally receptive to the administration when they recognize that the administration is acting as their advocates.

My biggest regret in leaving the Dean's Office is that I will no longer be able to serve the students as I would like.


