ATTENTION MEDICAL STUDENTS: The Myasthenia Gravis Foundation again offers eight research fellowships to medical students for work during vacation periods in the current school year with stipends of \$750 each. A program in either basic or clinical research related to problems of neuromuscular disease may be elected, but must be conducted under the supervision of a specified preceptor, in the student's own medical school or in another closer to the place of his vacation residence. Each application should be in the form of a letter and should include the following information: 1) Personal data, education and reason for applying 2) The proposed program and name of sponsor 3) A letter of recommendation from the sponsor outlining the proposed program of work and acceptance of the candidate. Applications should be submitted no later than April 1, 1970, to the Chairman of the Viets Fellowship Committee: Dr. Kenneth R. Magee, Professor, Department of Neurology, University of Michigan Medical Center, 1405 East Ann Street, Ann Arbor, Michigan 48104. Selection will be made by the committee in April and recipients will be notified as soon as possible. Within two months after completion of the Fellowship, a report of the project must be sent to Dr. Magee in duplicate.

The Woodruff Medical Center of Emory University, Department of Gynecology and Obstetrics is offering 10 summer fellowships to medical students to work in the fields of family planning and population studies. Positions are available in this country, Latin America, and the Far East. The fellowship is scheduled for June 9 - August 14, 1970. The stipend award is for \$900.
