This is in response to requests by several students who are planning Study-Away Programs in England and Scotland. Dr. Crellin is English and would like to share information as to the history of the hospitals, interesting places to see and things to do, the history of medical education and medical care in England, the history of a variety of English medical schools to which students apply and information on life as a medical student in these areas. 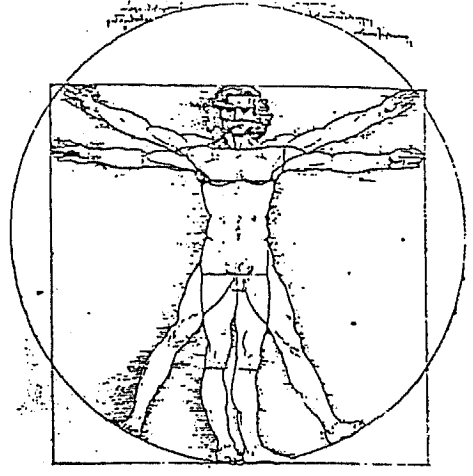

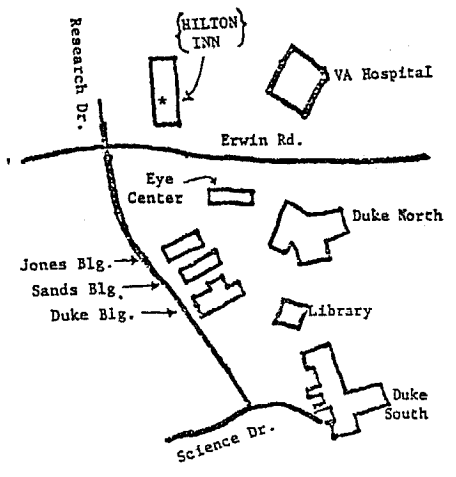
