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What is TBL?¹

"Team-based learning (TBL) combines independent out-of-class preparation with in-class small group discussion."

Essential Elements of TBL²

Groups • Accountability


Feedback • Assignment Design

Opportunities

- >Emphasizes hands-on group work
- ➤ Allows for minimal lecturing
- > Encourages discussion and interaction
- ➤ Promotes in-depth and higher level learning

Challenges

- > Requires faculty and student buy-in
- >Students may be uncomfortable with TBL
- ➤ More preparation time needed for instructors
- >Students must come to class prepared
