FOLLOW-UP STUDY OF MEDICAL STUDENTS IN NOVEMBER

In the fall of 1975 I administered a questionnaire to all freshmen medical students at Duke University, the University of North Carolina, and Bowman Gray School of Medicine. I was very pleased with students' cooperation in filling out the questionnaire. At Duke, 92% of the students returned the instrument. At that time, I sent all the freshmen medical students the preliminary results from that study. From the analysis of the questionnaire data I was able to write my doctoral dissertation in Sociology at Duke University (available at the Duke medical library) and to publish a few articles on the professional values and expectations of first year medical students (see the April 1978 issue of the Journal of Medical Education).


Presently, I have been funded by the National Institute of Mental Health to do a follow-up study of the same medical students at the three schools since these students are in their final year of medical school. In November, I will be sending out another questionnaire to all senior medical students at Duke. I would greatly appreciate your cooperation once again. In return for your efforts I will once again send to all students some summary tables of the results.

I plan to write a book concerning change in medical students' professional orientations during medical school from the analysis of the two questionnaires. In order to write this book, however, I need your cooperation in filling out and returning the questionnaire. I will be extremely grateful for your help.



NOTICE FOR SCHOLARSHIP RECIPIENTS

The Internal Revenue Service has ruled that all amounts paid to, or on behalf of, a student receiving a scholarship which requires the recipient to perform services for the grantor following training, constitutes gross taxable income.

However, the recipient of a scholarship funded by the Scholarship Program for First-Year Students of Exceptional Financial Need are <u>not required</u> to perform services of any kind in return for the training received and, therefore, the entire amount of the scholarship is considered to be tax exempt.

Beginning July, 1979, the Department of Internal Medicine, University of California at Davis will offer, in addition to its previously described traditional Categorical Medicine training program, a three year program in Primary Care Internal Medicine which is a track with increased emphasis on training in the outpatient management of certain traditional non-internal medicine problems and the diagnosis and management of subspecialty medical problems in an outpatient setting. Information on this program is in the Davison Office.

Beginning July 1, 1979, General Internal Medicine and General Pediatric residents for Baltimore City Hospitals will be offered for the first time.
