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The physician assistant concept holds the promise of substantially alleviating the crisis the United States experiences today in the provision of primary health care. Dr. Eugene Stead at Duke University fathered the concept believing that much of the service provided by primary care physicians could be rendered by persons less trained in bio-medical science and pathophysiology of disease.

In 1966 the first program was established at Duke University. Within five years, 14 programs were offering training for the assistant to the primary care physician. Parallel with this effort, the University of Washington and Dartmouth University began training senior military corpsmen in a manner that would permit them to adapt their skills to a civilian population. Although the approach was necessarily different, the end product, the Medex, was not dissimilar to the physician assistant graduate of the more traditional two year program.

# Physician Assistant—A Definition

The term physician assistant is necessarily generic and is used in reference to such new health professionals as physician assistant, child health associate. Medex, physician associate, tamily nurse practitioner, and others.

The American Medical Association officially defines a physician assistant as "a skilled person qualified by academic experience and practical on-the-job training to provide patient service under the supervision and direction of a licensed physician who is responsible for the performance of that assistant."

### Professional Role

The physician assistant is trained to effectively assist primary care physicians in their medical activities. While functioning within the parameters of the law under the supervision of a licensed physician, the physician assistant is expected to improve the physician's services by performing time-consuming medical or surgical tasks. Such procedures would include patient histories, physical examinations, diagnostic and therapeutic procedures, following care, and patient teaching and counseling.

## Legal Aspects

As of June, 1975, 37 states have enacted legislation permitting physicians to utilize physician assistants (PAs) in their practice of medicine. State legislation generally falls into the statute categories of general delegatory or regulatory. The general delegatory statute simply amends state medical practice acts permitting PAs to work under the supervision of physicians. The regulatory authority statute authorizes an organization (usually the state board of medical examiners) to establish rules and regulations recarding the requisite educational and employment qualifications for practicing PAs.

# Certification and Continuing Education

The National Certification Examination for Assistants to the Primary Care Physician is offered annually to qualified candidates. Developed under the direction of the National Commission on Certification of Physicians Assistants, the certification examination is administered by the National Board of Medical Examiners as an assurance to the public of a maintenance of the professions's high standards of competence and professionalism.

Upon successful completion of the examination, physician assistants must accumulate 100 hours of confluence medical education credits every two years to qualify for re-registration as a Physician Assistant-Certified. Recertification is granted every 6 years to those PA's successfully passing the recertification examination and accumulating the appropriate number of continuing medical education hours.

# **Employment Opportunities**

The potential job market for the graduate physician assistant is a bright one. Graduate and student PAs who are members of the American Academy of Physicians' Assistants (the professional organization representing graduates and current students of recognized PA programs) may take advantage of the National Employment Listing Service It others.

As a professional member of the health care team, the newly graduated physician assistant may expect to earn an economically attractive salary of \$12-14,000 per year.

# Admission Requirements

Specific admission requirements vary among new health practitioner programs across the country. Generally, the requirements for admission are a high school diploma or its equivalent (GED), a minimum of two years college course work and/or/health related training received in a civilian, or military/setting, scores from the ACT or SAT examinations, and three character references.

# Association of Physician Assistant Programs

The Association of Physician Assistant Programs is the organization which brings together new health practitioner programs of varying types. These programs vary in length from one to four years and in sponsorship from medical schools and junior colleges to schools of public health and universities with colleges of allied health. The training settings for these new health professionals range from predominantly clinical.

The Association is the only such organization of programs and is a natural forum for an exchange of ideas, research, curriculum development, and evaluation. Organized in 1972, the Association is a nonprofit organization operated exclusively for charitable and scientific purposes. Recognized nationally as the leader of the physician extender movement, the Association has grown to encompass virtually all programs accredited by the American Medical Association.


