AMENDMENT TO THE CONSTITUTION OF THE DAVISON SOCIETY

The following amendment to the Davison Society Constitution was submitted by the Committee on Combined Degree Programs: Ed Buckley, Sid Gospe, Anthony Limberakis, and David Schlossman. Additions to the Constitution are underlined. Deletions are in strike out type. This amendment will be voted on Wednesday, March 2 - Friday, March 4.

Article III. Membership

Section 1. Every student currently enrolled in Duke University Medical School is a member of the Davison Society. Every year at the commencement of Term III, each student who is enrolled in a combined degree program and who has completed the first year curriculum will be asked to choose whether he wishes to be considered a member of the class of combined degree students, or a member of the class of his choice. If a student does not respond, he will be assigned to the class of combined degree students. The class status of all other students will be determined by the Medical Center Registrar.


Article IV. Officers, Representatives, and Committees: Structure
Section 2. Each class shall have a Class President and four Class Representatives. The class of combined degree students shall have a Class President. If the class of combined degree students has between 32 and 52 members, they will also have a Class Representative. If there are 53 or more members they will have an additional Class Representative.

Section 6. Davison Council: The Davison Society Executive Council (Davison Council) shall be composed of the President, Service Vice-President, Social Vice-President, Treasurer, and Secretary of the Davison Society, the four five Class Presidents, and the four Class Representatives from each of the classes.

FOURTH YEAR STUDENTS

In December, Shifting Dullness published an announcement containing information on the National Association of Residents and Interns loan plan. Although no interest rates were included in the initial information packet, we have just received further notice

that the amount of money available has been increased from \$1,500 to \$2,600. The plan still retains all of its original features (still no interest rates available), including the special one-year deferred principal repayment benefit. During the first year of the loan only interest charges are paid. Then, starting with the 13th month, both principal and interest are repaid over an additional extended period. This benefit is especially helpful to students who generally have many bills coming due when they first start their PG year of training or enter practice.

Once a medical student has been matched, he/she may apply for an additional amount up to \$5,000, formerly \$2,500. The \$5,000 In-Training Loan Plan also offers the one-year deferred principal repayment option as mentioned above.

ROCK SLEYSTER SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM - THIRD YEAR STUDENTS

If you are a rising fourth year medical student, have a career interest in the field of psychiatry, and demonstrate financial need, you may be eligible for nomination to the Rock Sleyster Scholarship Program. Duke University School of Medicine has been invited to nominate one student for this \$2,000 scholarship. For academic year, 1977-78, there will be 12 of these scholarships awarded nationwide. 
