GRADUATION

MAY 10 & 11, 1980 ARE THE DATES SET FOR THIS YEAR'S COMMENCEMENT OF THE DUKE UNIVERSITY GRADUATE SCHOOLS. THE FORMAL HIPPOCRATIC OATH CEREMONY FOR THE MEDICAL SCHOOL WILL BE HELD IN THE CHAPEL ON SATURDAY, MAY 10. GRADUATION CEREMONIES CONDUCTED WITH THE OTHER SCHOOLS WILL BE HELD ON SUNDAY, MAY 11.

DURING THE YEAR MANY MEMOS WILL BE SENT TO THOSE GRADUATING. PLEASE READ EACH ONE. IF YOU DO NOT RECEIVE INFORMATION REGARDING GRADUATION DURING THE SPRING, PLEASE CONTACT DR. SHIRLEY OSTERHOUT'S OFFICE.

FOR THOSE SENIORS FINISHING EARLY WHO ARE NOT ABLE TO ATTEND THESE CEREMONIES IN MAY, THERE WILL BE A HIPPOCRATIC OATH CEREMONY OFFERED AT THE END OF EACH TERM. THOSE SENIORS FINISHING EARLY AND PLANNING TO RETURN IN MAY SHOULD BE SURE TO LEAVE A FORWARDING ADDRESS WITH THIS OFFICE IN ORDER TO RECEIVE THE ABOVE MENTIONED MEMOS.

SCHOLARSHIPS, EXTERNSHIPS

DAVISON SCHOLARSHIP

THE DAVISON SCHOLARSHIP IS WORTH \$1,000 AND IS AWARDED TO A STUDENT WHO PLANS A CLINICAL STUDY AWAY PROGRAM IN THE AREA OF PRIMARY CARE OUTSIDE THE CONTINENTAL U.S. THIS YEAR'S SCHOLARSHIP WILL BE AWARDED FOR STUDY DURING THE CALENDAR YEAR 1980. APPLICATIONS ARE AVAILABLE IN DR. SHIRLEY OSTERHOUT'S OFFICE. THE DUE DATE FOR RECEIPT OF BOTH THE DAVISON SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATION AND THE STUDY AWAY APPLICATION IS FEBRUARY 1, 1980. HOPEFULLY, A DECISION WILL BE MADE BY MARCH 1, 1980. ANY QUESTIONS SHOULD BE DIRECTED TO DR. SHIRLEY OSTERHOUT.

STUDY AWAY

ALL STUDENTS ARE REMINDED THAT STUDY AWAY FOR CREDIT MUST HAVE PRIOR APPROVAL FROM THE STUDY AWAY COMMITTEE. APPLICATION FORMS FOR STUDY AWAY ARE AVAILABLE IN DR. CHRISTAKOS' OFFICE. THESE APPLICATIONS SHOULD BE FILED THREE MONTHS PRIOR TO YOUR ANTICIPATED STUDY AWAY. YOU SHOULD NOTE THAT: (1) STUDY AWAY IS NOT POSSIBLE BEFORE SUCCESSFUL COMPLETION OF YOUR SECOND YEAR, ALTHOUGH PLANS MAY BE INITIATED DURING THE SECOND YEAR; AND (2) STUDY AWAY FOR CREDIT DOES NOT APPLY TO STUDENTS INVOLVED IN EXTERNSHIPS IN WHICH THEY RECEIVE FINANCIAL REIMBURSEMENT.

HOUSING

UPPERCLASSMEN NOT RECEIVING MAIL

ANY UPPERCLASSMAN WHO IS NOT CURRENTLY RECEIVING MAIL AT HIS/HER MEDICAL CENTER BOX MAY NOT HAVE A BOX. IF YOU ARE NOT NOW RECEIVING MAIL PLEASE CHECK WITH SOMEONE AT THE BASEMENT POST OFFICE TO MAKE SURE THAT YOUR NAME HASN'T INADVERTENTLY BEEN WITHDRAWN FROM THEIR LIST OF ENROLLED STUDENTS.

FINANCIAL AIDCOLLEGE WORK STUDY FUNDS (CWSP)

A LIMITED AMOUNT OF CWSP FUNDS ARE AVAILABLE THROUGH THE FINANCIAL AID OFFICE FOR 1979-1980.

THE PRIMARY PURPOSE OF THE CWSP IS TO STIMULATE AND PROMOTE THE PART-TIME EMPLOYMENT OF STUDENTS. THE PROGRAM IS DESIGNED FOR THOSE STUDENTS WHO HAVE GREAT FINANCIAL NEED AND A CWSP AWARD BECOMES PART OF THE FINANCIAL AID "PACKAGE". THIS ENABLES STUDENTS WITH THE GREATEST NEED TO MEET THEIR EDUCATIONAL EXPENSES WITHOUT INCURRING AN UNDULY HEAVY BURDEN OF INDEBTEDNESS. THEREFORE, STUDENTS DESIROUS OF CWSP MAY DIRECTLY REDUCE AN EQUAL SUM OF THE LOAN PORTION OF THE FINANCIAL AID "PACKAGE" ASSIGNED FOR 1979-1980.

THE VALUE OF CWSP IS THAT 80% OF THE STUDENT'S INCOME IS PAID BY CWSP AND 20% IS PAID BY THE EMPLOYER. LIKE OTHER FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE, CWSP FUNDS MAY NOT BE USED DURING PERIODS WHEN THE STUDENT IS NOT ENROLLED FOR ACADEMIC CREDIT. IF CWSP IS USED DURING A QUARTER WHEN THE STUDENT IS NOT ENROLLED, THE STUDENT MUST SAVE A SUBSTANTIAL PORTION OF THE INCOME FOR USE TOWARD EDUCATIONAL EXPENSES DURING SUBSEQUENT ENROLLMENT PERIODS.

AS WITH ANY OTHER EMPLOYMENT, NO ACADEMIC CREDIT MAY BE GIVEN FOR WORK PERFORMED UNDER CWSP. ADDITIONALLY, CWSP FUNDS MAY NOT BE USED IN ANY POLITICAL, RELIGIOUS, OR PROFIT-MAKING ACTIVITY. MOST JOBS IN THE UNIVERSITY AND MEDICAL CENTER QUALIFY FOR CWSP.

STUDENTS INTERESTED IN CWSP AS PART OF THEIR FINANCIAL AID PACKAGE SHOULD CONTACT THE OFFICE OF FINANCIAL AID NO LATER THAN SEPTEMBER 14, 1979, AND BRING WITH THEM A JOB DESCRIPTION WHICH INCLUDES: NAME OF EMPLOYER, ADDRESS, PURPOSE OF JOB, DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES, JOB QUALIFICATIONS, WAGE RATE OR RANGE, LENGTH OF EMPLOYMENT, AND NAME OF SUPERVISOR.
