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Table of Contents Email Delivery Via PubMed

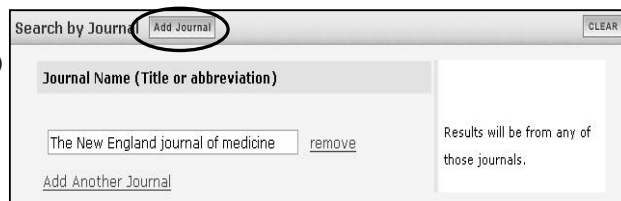
Set up an automated PubMed update in less than five minutes with a My NCBI account. Select your journals and have the table of contents (TOC) emailed directly to you.

My NCBI: Sign In

Connect to <http://www.mclibrary.duke.edu/pubmed>. In the upper-right corner of the screen or under *PubMed Services*, select **My NCBI**. If you have a My NCBI account, log in using your user name and password. New users may register by clicking on **register for an account**.

Search for a Journal

1. Click on the **Limits** tab.
2. Next to **Search by Journal**, select **Add Journal**.
3. Type in the full name or the abbreviation of the journal.
(i.e. *New England Journal of Medicine* or *N Engl J Med*)
4. Select the title from the drop down list.
5. Click **Go** next to the search box at the top.



Set Up Table of Contents Email Delivery

1. From the results screen, click on **Save Search** (to the right of the search box).
2. A new window will pop up with the question: "Would you like to receive e-mail updates of new search results?" (If you have not logged in, you will be prompted to do so first.)
3. Select **Yes**.
4. Enter the **email address** where you want the table of contents delivered.
5. Choose **how often** you would like to receive the new citations. **Note:** Journal publication schedules vary. To be sure you get the new Table of Contents as soon as possible, select "Every day." As new citations are added, you will receive an email.
6. Pick your preferences for delivery **format**. (We recommend "Abstract" as "HTML.")
7. Increase **maximum number of items to send** to **50**.
8. Click **OK**.

Changing Your Settings or Deleting a Journal

1. In the upper right corner of the screen or under *PubMed Services*, click on **My NCBI** and sign in to the system.
2. Under "Searches," find the journal title in your list of saved searches.
3. To make changes to this selection, click on the schedule link (under "Details").
4. To delete this selection, put a checkmark in the box next to the title and choose **Delete Selected** from the bottom of the page.


Where Is That Article? Verifying References Via PubMed

Both PubMed and Ovid offer simple forms that require only a few pieces of information to find or verify references. This month's issue offers details for verifying references using the **PubMed System**.

1. Single Citation Matcher (easiest and best way to verify references in PubMed)

Under "PubMed Services" on the left, open the Single Citation Matcher. Fill in at least two fields and then click on the "Go" button. As you begin typing in the journal or author field, you will be able to select from a *drop-down menu* that appears. If this does not retrieve the citation you are looking for, try typing in other information.

2. Search using two-letter field tags in the main search box

- **Author [au]** – *Author names are automatically truncated to account for varying initials.*
smith [au] – retrieves all authors with the last name "Smith"
smith t [au] – retrieves all authors with the last name "Smith" and first initial "T"
- **Title [ti]** – *Use the truncation symbol (*) to look for a root word and its variant endings.*
drowning [ti] – retrieves all articles with the word "drowning" in the title
drown* [ti] – retrieves all articles containing the root word "drown" and any variant endings anywhere in the title
cold water drowning [ti] – retrieves all articles with the phrase "cold water drowning" in the title
- **Journal Title [ta]** – *Search by journal title abbreviation or the full journal title.*
n engl j med [ta] – retrieves all articles in the journal "New England Journal of Medicine"
new england journal of medicine [ta] – retrieves all articles in the journal "New England Journal of Medicine"
chest [ta] – retrieves all articles in the journal "Chest"
- **Volume, Issue, or Page**
89 [vi] – retrieves all articles that are published in a volume numbered "89"
12 [ip] – retrieves all articles published in an issue numbered "12"
105 [pg] – retrieves articles *beginning* on page "105"

MASTER**

Exam Master Online is a Web-based tool for practicing and studying for the United States Medical Licensing Examination (USMLE) and a number of medical boards, including Family Practice, Internal Medicine, Pediatrics, Surgery, Obstetrics and Gynecology, and the Special Purpose Examination (SPEX). Initial registration from a computer with a Duke IP address is required. Once you register, Exam Master will issue you a password, which can be used to access the program from any location.
