### LUCE SCHOLARS PROGRAM

THE HENRY LUCE FOUNDATION HAS A PROGRAM UNDER WHICH EACH YEAR FIFTEEN

#### LUCE SCHOLARS PROGRAM, CONT'D

POTENTIAL AMERICAN LEADERS WYO ARE <u>NOT</u> AND DO NOT PLAN TO BECOME ASIAN OR INTERNATIONAL RELATIONS SPECIALISTS WILL SPEND 12 MONTHS STUDYING, WORKING, AND TRAVELING IN EAST ASIA. Duke has been invited to nominate 3 candidates for 1979-80.

ELIGIBILITY. FOR THESE HIGHLY COMPETITIVE AWARDS UNDERGRADUATES WHO WILL RECEIVE THE BACHELOR'S DEGREE IN MAY, GRADUATE AND PROFESSIONAL SCHOOL STUDENTS, AND RECENT GRADUATES WHO ARE AMERICAN CITIZENS ARE ALL ELIGIBLE. THE APPLICANTS CAN BE NO MORE THAN 29 YEARS OF AGE ON SEPTEMBER 1, 1979.
POTENTIALITY FOR LEADERSHIP IN THE UNITED STATES WILL BE THE PRINCIPAL CRITERION FOR SELECTION.

THE SCHOLARSHIP YEAR. SUCCESSFUL CANDIDATES WILL NOT BE ENROLLED IN ANY EDUCATIONAL INSTITUTION AND WILL NOT RECEIVE ACADEMIC CREDIT FOR THEIR WORK. THEY WILL BE GIVEN "A CONCENTRATED EXPOSURE TO A SPECIFIC ASIAN ENVIRONMENT WITHIN THE CONTEXT OF THEIR ABILITIES AND INTERESTS." PROGRAMS WILL CENTER ON A FORM OF WORK-STUDY ARRANGEMENT. THE AMOUNT OF EACH AWARD IS \$9,000 PLUS \$2,000 FOR A WIFE OR HUSBAND ACCOMPANYING THE SCHOLAR. AIR TRANSPORTATION WILL BE PROVIDED.

SELECTION PROCESS. INTERESTED STUDENTS SHOULD APPLY TO THE LUCE SCHOLARS COMMITTEE BY NOVEMBER I ON FORMS SECURED AT THE CENTER FOR INTERNATIONAL SUDIES, KOOM 103. THE COMMITTEE WILL THEN NOMINATE TO THE LUCE FOUNDATION. THIS WILL BE FOLLOWED BY ON-CAMPUS INTERVIEWS WITH THE NOMINEES. FINALISTS WILL COME BEFORE A SCREENING PANEL IN MARCH. SUCCESSFUL CANDIDATES WILL BE NOTIFIED AT THE END OF MARCH.
