# **Welcome to Your Gateway to Information!**

The Library staff welcomes our new and returning patrons to the Medical Center and our Library, your gateway to information! We offer the latest in online resources, strong print collections, as well as unique materials in our History of Medicine Collections. This newsletter issue provides you with an overview of the wide variety of resources and services available to you as Duke faculty, staff and students.

Many new resources have been added over the last six months, including more than doubling the number of online journals available. Ninety new titles have been linked through MEDLINE to Journals@Ovid, and access to over 250 journals is now available through the ScienceDirect service from Elsevier. Five more years have been added to the backfiles of the Web of Science database, and MD Consult has been added to provide access to textbooks, practice guidelines, and other resources. I encourage you to check out our Website and use it as your gateway to a variety of online electronic materials including databases, textbooks, clinical tool sets, and Websites.

Computers are also being upgraded throughout the Library. New PCs were installed in the electronic classroom in our Medical Library Education Center (on the lower level of the Library) this spring. The search stations in the reference area have been replaced and support Web interfaces for our databases. The computers in the Reserve Reading Room are scheduled for replacement in August and will include two new iMacs.

However, we are not just high tech! Just outside the electronic classroom, you will find our leisure reading collection, known as the Engel collection, and our display cases where we house exhibits focusing on our historical treasures, Duke authors, current services, and more!

You can also get access to a variety of personalized services by phone, through e-mail, or in person. Our professional librarians are available for consultations on how to search for information and use our resources. The educational calendar in this issue lists the various training sessions we offer; tours and orientations can be arranged for groups and individuals. Staff at all Information and Circulation Desks can assist you in locating materials in our Library. For assistance, please ask at any of the desks.

Again, I welcome you to our Library and hope that you fully use the services and resources available to you.

Borrowing Policies

Books - 4 weeks/1 renewal. *History* - 2 weeks/2 renewals. Audiovisuals - 1 week. 2 renewals.

Unbound journals - 2 hours. No renewals.

Bound journals - 1 day. No renewals.

Holds may be placed on materials which are signed out. Materials signed out may be recalled after two weeks.

Fines

Books and Audiovisuals - 50 cents a day. Journals - \$1.00 per hour, with no grace period. Reserves or noncirculating items - 50 cents per hour, with no grace period.

There is a three-day grace period for books and audiovisuals. If not returned within the grace period, fines accrue from the due date. Failure to return materials or pay fees may result in suspension of privileges.

• TRLN Borrower's Card

Permits borrowing of books at UNC, NCCU, and NCSU. Available at the Library's Circulation Desk.

• Campus-wide Borrower's Card

For library users not currently affiliated with the University. \$100 annual fee. Available at the Library's Circulation Desk. Various restrictions may apply.

#### **More Full Text Journals Available**


As you can see from the previous pages, the Library has nearly doubled the number of available full text electronic journals:

- Sixty-seven clinical and 23 nursing titles have been added to those in Ovid MEDLINE and other databases. You can read text of articles in these journals during the course of a search in the Ovid databases (just click on the "Full Text" link in the reference), or you can browse articles in an individual Ovid title -- they are marked with the Ovid Dogo in the list of e-journals on our Website.
- Elsevier Science is the largest publisher of biomedical journals. The Library has worked out a joint agreement with the UNC Health Sciences Library to offer to both campuses all of the Elsevier titles to which either subscribes, some 250 on a wide variety of subjects. # (Often Asked) Questions and (Some) Answers

### **Maurice Reece, Circulation Services**

Question: "How do I get access to MEDLINE and the other Ovid databases?"

**Answer: Personal Accounts** (username and password) are available for Duke faculty, graduate students and DUMC staff and students. Since they are not created automatically, you must apply through the Circulation Desk. For information call 660-1100. **Generic Access** is also available (no password required), but a user must connect from a machine with a Duke IP (Internet Protocol) address.

Question: "Is it better to have a personal account (a username and password) to access MEDLINE?"

**Answer: Yes**, if you want to take full advantage of the Ovid system's special features, such as saving search strategies, ordering copies of articles while searching, or using the SDI autoalert service, which allows you to save a search strategy and have it run automatically and sent to you by email whenever the database is updated. Also, if you wish to do a search via the Telnet version from any location outside of the Medical Center Library, you must have this account. If you are not interested in these special features, you may use the **Generic Access**.

Question: "When I am at home or away from campus, how do I access IP-restricted resources on the Web such as MD Consult and certain electronic journals and textbooks?"

**Answer:** Get an "acpub" account from Duke's Office of Information Technology (OIT). You can then connect to the databases using Duke as an ISP (Internet Service Provider). If you prefer to use a commercial ISP such as AOL or Mindspring, the "acpub" account allows you to connect to OIT's proxy server, in order to access databases that are restricted to Duke IP addresses. To set up an "acpub" account, contact the Office of Information Technology at 684-2200 or at the North Building.

Question: "I don't have access to the Internet. How can I use MEDLINE?"

**Answer:** You can directly dial the MCIS terminal server via your modem and use the Telnet version of MEDLINE (see page 3 for computer settings). You must have a **Personal Account** to access this database from any site outside the Medical Center Library. Remember, graphics (photos, charts, figures, etc.) in full text articles are not available via Telnet, which is the character-based version of Ovid.

Question: "Are there Telnet versions of resources like MD Consult and Harrison's Online?"

**Answer:** No. These resources are Web based and only accessible via the Internet.

Question: "I forgot my password to access MEDLINE. What do I do?"

**Answer:** Call Circulation Services at 660-1100. They can't tell you your password, but they can change it or allow you to create a new one. *Passwords may be created or changed ONLY via telnet*. You *cannot* create or change your password using the Ovid Web Gateway.

## **Electronic Reserves**

The Medical Center Library has developed an electronic reserves (e-reserves) system that we plan to implement this fall. As we introduce this system, we must also make sure our paper reserves meet all federal copyright laws and guidelines governing reserves. New procedures and policies for submitting items for both electronic and paper reserves will be implemented to ensure that we are in compliance.

Seeking copyright permission is not an easy or inexpensive task. It is often difficult to determine who owns the copyright to a book or journal article, since authors frequently sign over their rights to the publisher. The Library has to contact the publisher for permission, and often there is a royalty fee (ranging from a few dollars to hundreds of dollars for one semester) for using the article for reserves. The Library will be paying a fee to the Copyright Clearance Center for their assistance in locating the copyright holder and paying royalty fees, but it should result in faster processing of permissions for reserves.

Proposals for funding this service are currently in development, including charging a flat processing fee (such as \$3.00), and then subsidizing royalty fees up to a certain amount. Once these issues are finalized, information about the new system will be distributed to all faculty. 
For the inquiring mind...Come in from the heat and explore the best of the treasures of the History of Medicine Collections.
