It seems that much time has passed since our last meeting with you here in Cincinnati and in fact it has — so back to the business at hand. Enclosed you will find the Proposed Constitution for the merged organization. It is, of course, based majorly on the College's Constitution. In lieu of having received from you the official minutes of our initial negotiations, we compiled our notes with additions for the composition of the National Executive Committee for the merged organization as you will note on reviewing the enclosed. This proposal has passed the vote of the total Executive Committee at our Quarterly Meeting of January 20, 1973. At this same meeting, I was enjoined to formally request the Proposed By-Laws for the merged organization from you as was agreed upon in our first negotiation meeting.

Since this exchange of documents will take place at the end of January or the beginning of February at the latest, the Executive Committee of the College would like to extend a formal invitation to the Academy in the persons of its President and President-Elect for a second negotiation meeting to be held in a neutral area, Chicago, Illinois, sometime in latter February or early March at your convenience. We would also extend an invitation to the American Medical Association for a mediator of their choice from their association to attend this second negotiation session. May we suggest that the date be set on a Saturday for the convenience of the majority of those to attend. Upon receiving word from you of a date convenient to you, we will be better able to contact the A.M.A. directly with an invitation to attend on that date.

5	ARTICLE I	- NAME	
6 7 8	SECTION 1.	The name of this organization is the AMERICAN SOCIETY OF PHYSICIANS ASSISTANTS, hereafter referred to as "THE SOCIETY."	
9 10	ARTICLE II	- PURPOSE	
11 12 13 14 15	SECTION 1.	THE SOCIETY is formed as a non-profit organization to encourage and guide schools which will develop the skills and knowledge needed to perform the tasks prescribed by the physician and/or institution utilizing the services of physician's assistants.	
16 17 18 19 20 21	SECTION 2	THE SOCIETY is formed to develop criteria leading to accreditation of schools for physician's assistants; to improve the educational standards of schools or institution having programs or study courses leading to the development of certified physician's assistants.

23 24	SECTION 3.	THE SOCIETY is formed to develop criteria leading to the certification of all physician's assistants.

ARTICLE VIII - COMMITTEES

- SECTION 1. The Standing Committees of THE SOCIETY shall consist of Continuing Education, Legal and Ethics, Fiscal Affairs, Membership-Credentials and Benefits, Research, Student Affairs, Intra-Organizational Liaison, and Public Affairs and Information.
- SECTION 2. At the first election Continuing Education and Legal and Ethics shall be elected to two year terms; Student Affairs and Intraorganizational Liaison shall be elected to one year terms by the membership of the American Academy of Physicians' Associates. At the same time, Fiscal Affairs, Membership-Credentials and Benefits, Research and Public Affairs and Information shall be elected to one and two year terms, alternately, by the membership of the American College of Physicians Assistants. Thereafter, all Chairmen shall be elected by the membership of THE SCCIETY to two year terms on an alternating basis except for Student Affairs and Research which will be filled by student members with one year terms.
- SECTION 3. Ad Hoc Committees shall be commissioned as needed by the National Executive Committee.

ARTICLE IX - GENERAL POWERS OF THE SOCIETY

- SECTION 1. THE SOCIETY shall have the power to own, accept, acquire, mortgage and dispose of real and personal properties and to obtain, invest and retain funds in advancing the purposes stated in Article II. Any contractual agreement entered into by THE SOCIETY must be signed by two of the following national officers: the President, the Treasurer and/or the Secretary and must be approved in advance by the National Executive Committee.
- SECTION 2. THE SOCIETY shall have the power to do any lawful act or anything reasonably necessary or desirable for carrying out the purposes of THE SOCIETY and for protecting the lawful rights and interests of its members in connection therewith.
- SECTION 3 THE SOCIETY, through the National Executive Committee, maintains the right to internal controls in matters concerning professional ethics, membership, continuing education and the structure and

governing of its Chapters.
