MARY HOWELL - PEDIATRICIAN, AND AUTHOR OF HELPING OURSELVES: FAMILIES AND THE HUMAN NETWORK AND HEALING AT HOME, WHICH ENCOURAGE PEOPLE TO BECOME MORE RESPONSIBLE FOR THEIR OWN AND THEIR CHILDREN'S HEALTH; FORMER DEAN OF WOMEN AT HARVARD WITH AN INTERESTING PERSPECTIVE ON WOMEN IN MEDICINE (AUTHOR OF WHY WOULD A GIRL GO INTO MEDICINE?).

## **PUZZLE**

The solution to last week's puzzle:
(1) Day on which X was admitted: Sunday
(2) X's age: 18
(3) Today: Ihursday

The answer to the question of the patient's age was found simply by using the two equations X+A=24 and 12+A=X, where 'X' is the age of the patient and 'A' is the number of years that have passed since the patient's sister was the age that the patient is now. To answer the second part of the question: If today is thursday, then last Saturday (the day when the day before yesterday was referred to as "the day after tomorrow") would be six days away from tomorrow (Friday), and yesterday (Wednesday) would be six days away from next Tuesday (the day on which we will be able to speak of last Monday as "A week ago yesterday").
