STUDENT SCIENTIFIC EXHIBIT: At a recent meeting of the Executive Council of the Medical Society of the State of North Carolina, the Council approved the appropriation of a two hundred dollar (\$200.00) cash award to a worthy "un-sponsored student scientific exhibit" at the annual session to be held in Pinehurst, North Carolina, May 16-20, 1970. It is hoped that this award will prove an inducement to medical students to participate in the scientific exhibits division. In explanation of the award, President Edgar T. Beddingfield, Jr. stated, "a proper qualifying statement would be that those exhibits by students that would be considered for this award, would be those for which a student or group of students were identified as the principle investigators."
