NATIONAL STUDENT RESEARCH FORUM

This is the call for abstracts and papers to be presented at the 1981 National Student Research Forum to be held on the campus of The University of Texas Medical Branch, Galveston, April 22, 23, 24, 25, 1981. The Forum is open to medical students, graduate students registered at medical schools, interns, and residents, and is designed to include papers on research in the basic and clinical sciences. The presentations may include work which is completed or in progress, published or unpublished. In order to enter the Excellence of Research Competition, a student must also submit a manuscript. The purpose of the competition is to recognize and to encourage outstanding research in the basic and clinical sciences. The prizes consist of the Mead Johnson Awards, given for overall excellence of research, and of categorical awards within specific areas of research.

The abstract and the preregistration form must be postmarked no later than December 1, 1980. For further information see Jeanne Lee in Dr. Christakos' Office or contact Dan Siedler at Box #2867.

FISKE FUND PRIZE DISSERTATION - 1980

The Trustees of the Fiske Fund of the Rhode Island Medical Society announce the following for the Prize Dissertation of 1980: Medicine and Regulatory Law: Is Rationing Inevitable? The awarding of prizes and the amounts are made at the discretion of the Trustees. Awards, if any, may vary from a minimum of \$200 to a maximum of \$1,000. The dissertation will be particularly graded on the basis of original work by the author.

Dissertations, other than the successful ones, will be returned to the authors. The dissertation must be typewritten, double spaced on standard typewriter paper and should not exceed 10,000 words. HENDERSON MEMORIAL STUDENT AWARD

Applications for the Henderson Memorial Student Award are invited by the American Geriatrics Society.

Any medical student may submit his/her name for consideration. At least one letter of support from a faculty person is required. Special consideration will be given to students (1) who have engaged in research or clinical investigation in geriatrics; or (2) are participating in an ongoing clinical geriatric project. A formal paper is <u>not</u> required, but is welcome. Please submit in duplicate.

The award includes an honorarium to be presented at the Society's Annual Meeting in Boston, Massachusetts on April 30 - May 2, 1981, which the recipient will attend as an invited guest of the Society.

SCHOLARSHIPS

FULBRIGHT-HAYS SCHOLARSHIPS

Over 500 of these grants are awarded annually. They provide one year of graduate study abroad in approximately fifty countries from Argentina to Zaire. Candidates must have "study plans or projects in their major fields that can be completed in only one country and in one academic year. Selection is made on the basis of the applicants' academic or professional record, language preparation (where appropriate), the feasibility of the proposed study project, and personal qualifications." Since the study plan is an essential part of the application, candidates should begin working on it well before the autumn they apply for the grant.

MARSHALL SCHOLARSHIPS

Thirty scholarships are given annually for two (to three) years of study in a degree program at any British University. Among the criteria for selection of Marshall Scholars are "distinction of intellect and character as evidenced both by their scholastic attainments and by their other activities and achievements. Preference will be given to candidates who combine high academic ability with the capacity to play an active part in the life of the United Kingdom university to which they go, and to those who display a potential to make a significant contribution to their own society." Candidates should be able to explain their reasons for choosing a particular university in Britain. To be eligible applicants must not have reached their twenty-fifth birthday by October 1 of the year of application. The minimum cumulative GPA required is 3.7.
