**JUNIOR MEDICAL STUDENTS;** The U.S. Public Health Service announces the Senior Commissioned Officer Student Training and Extern Program for the 1973-1974 academic year. The program allows a medical student to enter the U.S. Public Health Service Reserve Corps as a Junior Assistant grade officer (equivalent to a Navy Ensign) while still in training. The officer is placed on active duty at his medical school to complete the final year of training, during which time he receives the full pay and allowances of his grade and, in addition, his tuition and fees are paid by the Public Health Service. In return for this support, the officer obligates himself to active duty with the U.S. Public Health Service following completion of internship. In order to receive additional information, mail one of the prepaid cards to the Commissioned Personnel Operations Division, Rockville, Maryland. These cards are found on the bulletin board in the Medical Student Lounge. The deadline for receipt of applications is February 1, 1973.
