SUMMER FELLOWSHIP PROGRAM IN REHABILITATION MEDICINE: Stanford University Medical Center and Regional Affiliated Hospitals announces the Summer Fellowship Program in Rehabilitation Medicine. The program is scheduled for June 21 - August 20, 1971, and any full time undergraduate medical student is eligible to apply. The stipend award is \$600.00. The program is designed to stimulate an awareness, interest and understanding of the total comprehensive rehabilitation process by providing the student with multiple medical experiences, primarily in Physical Medicine, Orthopedics, Plastic and Reconstructive Surgery and Community and Preventive Medicine. THE MYASTHENIA GRAVIS FOUNDATION AWARD: The Myasthenia Gravis Foundation again offers eight (8) research fellowships to medical students for work during vacation periods in the current school year with stipends of seven hundred and fifty dollars (\$750) each. A program in either basic or clinical research related to problems of neuromuscular disease may be elected, but must be conducted under the supervision of a specified preceptor, in the student's own medical school or in another closer to the place of his vacation residence. There are no formal application forms. Each application should be in the form of a letter and should include the following information:

1. Personal data, education and reason for applying.
2. The proposed program and name of sponsor.
3. A letter of recommendation from the sponsor outlining the proposed program of work and acceptance of the candidate.
