# NATIONAL STUDENT RESEARCH FORUM

THE 1980 NATIONAL STUDENT RESEARCH FORUM IS SPONSORED BY A GRANT FROM THE AMERICAN MEDICAL ASSOCIATION EDUCATION RESEARCH FOUNDATION AND WILL BE HELD IN GALVESTON, TEXAS, APRIL 23-26, 1980. THERE ARE FOUR AWARDS WHICH ARE GIVEN TO MEDICAL STUDENIS WHO SUBMIT WINNING ABSTRACTS. THESE PAPERS COMPETE IN THE "EXCELLENCE OF RESEARCH AWARDS". THE MATERIAL PRESENTED IN THE MANUSCRIPT (PAPER) AT THE FORUM MUST NOT BE PUBLISHED EITHER IN PART OR IN WHOLE PRIOR TO THE FORUM. PRIOR PUBLICATION OF THE ABSTRACT IS PERMISSIBLE. THE MANUSCRIPT IS LIMITED TO 3,500 WORDS AND MUST BE WRITTEN IN ENGLISH. IT SHOULD INDICATE THE PROBLEM UNDER CONSIDERATION AND ITS SIGNIFICANCE. IN ADDITION, IT SHOULD DESCRIBE THE MEANS AND MATERIALS USED IN THE SOLUTION OF THE PROBELM. FINALLY, IT SHOULD STATE THE RESULTS, THEIR SIGNIFICANCE, AND THEIR APPLICABILITY TO BROADER FIELDS OF KNOWLEDGE. # UNIVERSITY OF PITTSBURGH, INTERNAL MEDICINE

WE HAVE RECENTLY BEEN NOTIFIED BY THE UNIVERSITY OF PITTSBURGH, SCHOOL OF MEDICINE, DEPARTMENT OF MEDICINE, THAT THERE HAVE BEEN CHANGES IN THE POSTGRADUATE TRAINING PROGRAM IN INTERNAL MEDICINE. THERE ARE TWO PROGRAMS, ONE BASED AT THE PRESBYTERIAN-UNIVERSITY AND V.A. HOSPITALS AND THE OTHER BASED AT MONTEFIORE HOSPITAL, BOTH OPERATING WITHIN THE UNIVERSITY HEALTH CENTER AT PITTSBURGH. (INSTRUCTION IN MEDICINE FOR THE MEDICAL STUDENTS AT THE UNIVERSITY IS GIVEN IN BOTH OF THESE PROGRAMS.) DURING THE PAST TWO MONTHS A NUMBER OF CHANGES HAVE BEEN SET IN MOTION WHICH WILL STRENGTHEN EVEN FURTHER THE TWO TRAINING PROGRAMS IN INTERNAL MEDICINE AT THE MEDICAL SCHOOL. THESE STEPS INCLUDE RECRUITMENT TO FILL THE PRESENT FACULTY VACANCIES AND PLANNING FOR JOINT FELLOWSHIPS.

THE COORDINATION OF THESE TWO PROGRAMS PERMITS APPLICANTS FOR FIRST YEAR POSTGRADUATE TRAINING IN INTERNAL MEDICINE AT THE UNIVERSITY OF PITTSBURGH TO INTERVIEW FOR BOTH PROGRAMS IN A SINGLE DAY, INTERVIEWS FOR BOTH PROGRAMS ARE STRONGLY ENCOURAGED.
