



EXTERNSHIPS

COMMUNITY TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE PROGRAM

THE AMSA FOUNDATION COMMUNITY TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE PROGRAM (CTAP) OFFERS THE MEDICAL STUDENT A UNIQUE OPPORTUNITY TO EXPERIENCE THE REWARDS AND PROBLEMS ASSOCIATED WITH ESTABLISHING HEALTH SERVICES IN A MEDICALLY UNDERSERVED COMMUNITY. MOST SUCH AREAS HAVE AN INADEQUATE ECONOMIC BASE TO SUPPORT THE TRADITIONAL, PRIVATE ENTREPRENEUR MODEL OF MEDICINE. TO ESTABLISH AND CONDUCT SUCCESSFUL HEALTH SERVICES, HEALTH PROVIDERS WILL, IN ADDITION TO THE CLINICAL, LEARN TO DEAL WITH POLITICAL, SOCIAL, CULTURAL, AND GOVERNMENTAL ELEMENTS OF THE COMMUNITY.

ACTIVITIES FALL THEORETICALLY INTO SEVERAL CATEGORIES: BUILDING LINKAGES BETWEEN COMMUNITIES AND RESOURCES, GRANT WRITING, PROVIDING CLINICAL SERVICES, HEALTH EDUCATION, PROVIDER RECRUITMENT, COLLECTION OF DATA, ASSESSMENT OF HEALTH NEEDS, DEVELOPING COOPERATIVE HEALTH SYSTEMS, BASIC ORGANIZATION OF COMMUNITY EFFORTS, PUBLICIZING COMMUNITY NEEDS TO PROVIDERS, FUNDERS, AND LEGISLATORS.

(TAP currently has eleven active sites in six states. One site is urban ((NOXVILLE); THE REMAINDER ARE RURAL. SIX STATES ARE REPRESENTED: IN, IX, LA, MS, GA, NC. AN ASPECT OF THE PROGRAM FOUND ATTRACTIVE BY STUDENTS IS THE OPPORTUNITY TO DEVELOP LONG REMEMBERED RELATIONSHIPS WITH PEOPLE AT THE COMMUNITY LEVEL. THE COMMUNITY EXPERIENCE MAY ENABLE THE STUDENT FOR THE FIRST TIME TO EXPERIENCE A HUMANISTIC APPROACH TO MEDICINE.

TRAVEL TO AND FROM THE PROJECT WILL BE PROVIDED AT A RATE NOT TO EXCEED ROUND TRIP COACH AIRFARE.

STUDENT PARTICIPANTS WILL RECEIVE AN EIGHT-WEEK ALLOWANCE OF \$130 PER WEEK.

STUDENTS.
