Last year the Academy took a giant step towards reaching one of its most important goals—educating the general public about the vital role Physician Assistants play in our health care delivery system. This was accomplished through the development of our first TV public service announcement, which was distributed to more than 200 television stations nationwide and viewed by more than 100 million Americans last year. We feel this program was highly successful and helped to increase public awareness of the Physician Assistant profession.

There are 11,000 Physician Assistants in this country. As a growing segment of our health team, they're making needed health care more available to more people.

To help reinforce this growing awareness of our profession, Stuart Pharmaceuticals has provided a grant for the production and distribution of a new public service announcement for 1980. This year, we're providing TV stations with both 30 and 60-second versions so that station managers can better accommodate our announcement into their broadcast schedules, increasing the likelihood of more air time this year.

As you may know, a public service announcement runs on time donated by the television station. It cannot be self-serving to the sponsoring organization or carry a commercial message. Working together, our Public Education Committee and headquarters staff
