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**OBSTETRICS AND GYNECOLOGY INTERNSHIP** - Due to an administrative error, the internship in Obstetrics and Gynecology at the University of Chicago Hospitals and Clinics was left off the A.M.A. Listing in their directory. The Department of Obstetrics and Gynecology at Chicago Lying-In Hospital offers four post M.D. degrees:

1) Straight internship in Obstetrics and Gynecology followed by a 3-year residency in Obstetrics and Gynecology; 2) 3-year clinical residency in Obstetrics and Gynecology (no Internship required) followed by 2 years specialization in one of the subspecialties as: Oncology, Endocrinology and Infertility or Maternal and Fetal Medicine or Research; 3) 3-year residency in Obstetrics and Gynecology (no Internship required) followed by 1-year super-chief position in Clinical Obstetrics and Gynecology; and 4) 4-year residency in Obstetrics and Gynecology (no Internship required). Stipends for house officers range from \$10,100 to \$12,900. **NIMH PSYCHIATRIC RESIDENCY AND INTERNSHIP PROGRAM** - St. Elizabeth's Hospital is now accepting applications for its Rotating Internship with major emphasis in Psychiatry (P-6). The program consists of four months of medical training and eight months of inpatient psychiatry. If followed by two years of psychiatric residency the trainee may complete his residency requirements in Psychiatry. The first year residency level can be entered upon completion of a straight, rotating or mixed internship and is conducted at the community mental health center where the resident works with a small group of patients. The second year is focused on intensive psychotherapy of outpatients, involving individual psychotherapy, group therapy, and family therapy. The third year consists of elective experiences from the available clinical and research opportunities. Stipends range from \$10,318 to \$12,660.
