1974 ALFRED A. RICHMAN ESSAY CONTEST - The American College of Chest Physicians announces the 1974 Alfred A. Richman Essay Contest. The annual contest was instituted 25 years agoin the interest of motivating and encouraging scientific inquiry in respiration and circulation among undergraduate medical students. The contest offers medical students throughout the world the opportunity to submit, in open competition, manuscripts on any phase of the diagnosis and treatment of cardiovascular or pulmonary disease. A certificate of merit and cash awards are presented to the undergraduate medical student selected by the judges for the best essays on cardiovascular and pulmonary diseases. The first place award is \$500, second place award is \$300, and third place award is \$200. The medical school attended by the first place winner receives a trophy inscribed with the name of the winner and medical college. The deadline for submitting applications is March 31, 1974.
