## FELLOWSHIPS

### MAP FELLOWSHIP

The MAP - Reader's Digest International Fellowships Program is available to final year medical students. This fellowship provides clinical experience in a third world, relatively primitive setting. Students are presented with first-hand knowledge of health problems in that segment of the world population which has the least access to adequate medical care. The fellowship covers 75% of the round trip air fare from the recipient's medical school to the developing country. Recipients are determined by a Selection Committee of MAP International. The Committee meets in mid-March and mid-September. The student must participate for a minimum of 8 - 10 weeks. If you are interested, further information is available in Doctor Christakos' office.

## FELLOWSHIPS / CLEVELAND CLINIC

The Cleveland Clinic Educational Foundation is offering 1-2 month paid fellowships in Anesthesiology and Psychiatry to medical students. The positions are open year round and will be accompanied by a stipend of \$200-\$300 / month.

The fellowship in Psychiatry offers positions on either the 20-bed Child and Adolescent service or the 28-bed adult inpatient unit. Students will participate in the planning and delivery of treatment, and will become familiar with the process of individual and group therapy, assertiveness training, behavior therapy, and biofeedback treatment.

The fellowship in Anesthesiology will introduce students to the support of life functions under the stress of anesthetic and surgical manipulation, the clinical management of the unconscious patient, and the management of problems in cardiac and respiratory resuscitation. Teaching will be done primarily in the operating room and will be supplemented with exposure to the intensive care unit. Students will be expected to attend Anesthesiology conferences.

## JOB OPPORTUNITY / NORTH CAROLINA STUDENT RURAL HEALTH COALITION

The North Carolina Student Rural Health Coalition is offering all medical, PA, and senior nursing students the opportunity to live and work as physical examiners for health fairs in three rural North Carolina communities. Health fairs provide free physical exams, laboratory work, follow-up, rights-and-benefits counseling and health education to rural populations with poor access to these services. All students receive a stipend (\$110-\$125/wk.), free housing in the community, and the chance to be part of an ongoing effort in community development.

Students enjoy an educational clinical experience as well: precepting physicians from Duke and UNC review all patient work-ups and wrap up the working day by discussing instructive cases.
