TRAINESHIPS IN PUBLIC HEALTH - The Health Research Training Program of the New York City Department of Health announces its 1973 summer program for medical students. First, second and third year students are eligible to attend. The program features personal participation in health research projects, training in epidemiology and research methods, seminars on subjects of current public health importance, and field visits to operating public health programs. The program lasts from June 18 to August 23 and a stipend of \$84.00/week, tax free, will be provided. Assistance will also be provided in obtaining residence hall accommodations at reasonable rates. Applications should be submitted by March 12, 1973 and may be obtained in the Office of the Associate Director for Undergraduate Medical Education, 295 Baker House.
