The American Association of Surgeon's Assistants (AASA) was established in 1973. Its charter states the aims of the organization which are to provide a forum for peer regulation of career professionalism and excellence, to serve as an official representative of the Surgeon's Assistant within the medical profession, to local, state and national legal and professional entities, as well as to the lay public. The AASA is a non-profit organization.

Some of the services provided by the AASA include:

- continuing medical education in the surgical subspecialties
- published media in which to present opinions, questions, concerns and clinical research
- · update on legislation
- provides an insight into the scope of the professional roles of individual surgical physician assistants

Annual membership fees provide:

- 1) quarterly journal
- 2) bimonthly newsletter
- 3) reprints of medical research of interest to the general membership

Membership requirements have been established providing four levels of participation: Fellow

Associate Student Honorary

Membership requirements for the American Association of Surgeon's Assistants as stipulated in Article IV are reprinted herein for your information. Questions regarding membership or appeal of rejected membership application should be directed to the chairman of the Membership Committee.

ARTICLE IV (MEMBERSHIP REQUIREMENTS)

- Section 1 The membership of the Association shall be divided into four distinct categories; namely Fellow Member, Associate Member, Student Member and Honorary
- Section 2 Requirements to be met prior to conferring the title of "Fellow AASA" are as follows:
 - Fellows in the AASA will be required to have completed two years of college training or its equivalent prior to entering and completing an AMA/ACS (Joint Review Committee) approved Surgeon's Assistant Training Program.
 - B. Anyone not meeting the stipulations in (A) may be eligible for the title of "Fellow" providing he or she has successfully graduated from an AMA/ACS (Joint Review Committee) approved Physician's Assistant Program of at least eighteen months duration which can culminate in the ewarding of at least a baccalsureate degree and has met the stipulations of Article IV, Section 2, Paragraphs C or D.
 - Caraduate of an AMA/ACS (Joint Review Committee) approved Physician's Assistant Program of at least eighteen months duration with a surgery tract that ensures six months of clinical training on surgical rotations. In addition, said program must ensure adequate didactic instruction in anatomy, fundamentals of general surgery, sterile technique, introduction to the operating from and principles of-surgical care.
 - D. Graduate of an AMA/ACS (Joint Review Committee) approved Physician's Assistant Program of at least eighteen months duration without a surgery tract who has been employed by a Board certified surgeon or hospital in the capacity of a Surgeon's Assistant for at least twelve months.
- Section 3 An issociate membership in the AASA may be conferred on graduates of AMA/ACS (Joint Review Committee) and provide in the control of the concept of the control of the control of the consurgeons or hospitals in the capacity of a Surgeon's Assistant, but have not as yet completed tyelve months of such employment. Completion of twelve months of such employment entitles such Associate
- members to apply for "Fellowship" in the ASSA.

 The title of "Honorary Fellow" may be conferred upon deserving persons whose activities have been beneficial to the profession and ASSA, and, as such, are deserving of recognition. Candidates for the classification of "Honorary Fellow" must be sponsored by a Fellow of the ASSA.
- Section 5 The classification of "Fellow" in the AASA entitles one to full rights with voting privileges.
- Section 6 Associate members of the AASA may not vote or hold executive positions. However, they may participate in any committee work. In addition, Associate members may designate one individual to participate in Executive Committee discussions.
- Section 7 Student membership is restricted to those individuals matriculating through AMA/ACS (Joint Review Committee) approved Surgeon's Assistant Training Programs or Physician's Assistant Programs as defined in Article IV, Section 2, Paragraphs B and C.
- Section 8 Students do not have the right to vote or hold executive positions. However, a student council will be elected each year at the time of balloting for Executive Committee positions. The student council shall consist of a president, vice-president and secretary. The president of the student council has a vote on the Executive Committee.
- Section 9 The Membership Committee shall be responsible for ruling on applicant eligibility according to the membership requirements. The Membership Committee will submit eligible applicants to the Executive Committee for final approval.
