

Methods: Collaborate with Australian health librarians to plan and present a 3-day residential EBP institute

- September 2009, CS teaches an EBM class at ICML Brisbane, Qld, Australia
- April 2010, LK and CS begin planning via Skype to organize Australian EBP Institute in Brisbane
- May – Nov 2010, 5 Australian and 2 US instructors meet monthly via Skype to plan curriculum
- June 2010, venue is chosen – Cromwell College, University of Queensland
- July 2010 registration opens and fills quickly; 24 librarians from all states and territories
- Nov 29 to Dec 2 2011 – Evidence-Based Practice Librarians' Residential Seminar



OBJECTIVE: To expand the opportunities for continuing education to international medical librarians

Methods: Modify an existing online MLA course into a 3-day residential course for Australia

- Online course is designed as an introduction to the process of EBM
- Format is a combination of course manual, independent readings, exercises and discussion board presented through Blackboard
- 8 consecutive weeks; takes approximately 30 hours to complete
- Between 1999 and Fall 2011, 531 students have completed the course:
 - 422 from US -- 92 SILS Library School students
 - **60 from Australia**
 - 30 from Canada
 - 19 from India, UK, New Zealand, Finland, Brazil, Hong Kong, Czechoslovakia, Lebanon, Thailand, Kenya, Chile and Singapore
- **Residential 3 day course** covers same content
- Combines large group lectures of basic content with small group practice sessions
- Requires additional instructors/tutors and exercises for small group activities
