# CALICER SYMPOSIUM

A CANCER SYMPOSIUM FOR THE MEDICAL STUDENTS OF NORTH CAROLINA IS BEING PLANNED BY THE PROFESSIONAL EDUCATION COMMITTEE OF THE N.C. DIVISION OF THE AMERICAN CANCER SOCIETY. THE SYMPOSIUM WILL BE HELD AT THE PUKE INIVERSITY COMPREHENSIVE CANCER CENTER, DURHAM, NC, ON SATURDAY, MARCH 22, 1980 FROM 10 AM - 4:30 PM.

THIS SYMPOSIUM IS FOR MEDICAL STUDENTS IN THE CLINICAL YEARS, AND THE PURPOSE OF THE COMFFRENCE IS TO ADDRESS PERTINENT TOPICS IN THE CARE OF CANCER PATIENTS WHICH ARE NOT STRESSED IN CURRENT MEDICAL SCHOOL CURRICULUMS. THE PROGRAM WILL BE DIVIDED INTO THREE PARTS; DETECTION AND DIAGNOSIS, TREATMENT, AND SUPPORTIVE CARE. IT WILL CONCLUDE WITH A PANEL DISCUSSION ON ETHICAL CONSIDERATIONS. THE APPROACH WILL BE CLINICAL AND PRAGMATIC.

THE STUDENT WILL ENCOUNTER AND SHARE RESPONSIBILITY IN THE CARE OF INFATIENTS ON THE WARDS OF THE NEW 65 BED SACRED HEARTH CHILDREN'S HOSPITAL, THE REGIONAL MEGNATAL-PERINATAL INTENSIVE CARE CENTER, PRIMARY CARE IN THE AMBULATORY CARE CENTER, AND THE SPECIALTY CLINICS FOR CHRONIC DISEASE PROBLEMS IN CHILDREN.

THE COMMUNITY PROGRAMS FOR CEREBRAL PALSY, MENTAL PETARDATION, MENTAL HEALTH, SPEECH AND HEARING, LEARNING DISABILITIES, SPECIAL EDUCATION, MOPTION, JUVENILE JUSTICE, THE PUBLIC HEALTH SERVICE PROGRAMS IN PURAL HEALTH, SCHOOL HEALTH, TE, VD, IMMUNIZATION, WELL-BABY AND PLANNED PARENTHOOD ARE ALSO AVAILABLE.


THIS WEEK'S PUZZLE:
THE TWENTY-FIVE CIRCLES IN THE FIGURE BELOW CARRY, AS YOU CAN SEE, FIVE DIAMOND-SHAPED COUNTERS LETTERED A.B.C.D.E.

THE PROBLEM IS TO REARRANGE THE COUNTERS BY SLIDING THEM ALONG THE LINES SO THAT YOU FINISH UP WITH NO LINE (EITHER HORIZONTAL, VERTICAL, OR DIAGONAL) HAVING ON IT MORE THAN ONE COUNTER.

COUNTERS ARE NOT PERMITTED TO HOP OVER ONE ANOTHER WHEN SLIDING ALONG THE LINES, FOR INSTANCE, IF YOU WANT TO MOVE COUNTER D TO CIRCLE 2, IT WILL MEAN THAT C WILL FIRST HAVE TO BE MOVED SOMEWHERE ELSE. OTHERWISE, MOVEMENT IN A STRAIGHT LINE ALONG ANY NUMBER OF FREE SPACES COUNTS AS ONLY ONE MOVE.
