Mrs. Jan Proctor, Head, North Carolina Educational Loan Program, Raleigh, N.C., and her staff have accepted an invitation from the Office of Financial Aid for a presentation on:

Although this program has been in operation for many years, this is the program officers' first visit to our school.

Mrs. Proctor and her staff will describe the purpose, history, and success of the program. It is particularly gratifying to see tax dollars supporting as worthwhile and successful program as this.

The North Carolina Educational Loan Program provides educational funds to North Carolinians who are enrolled in, or have been accepted into, schools in medicine and health related fields. Upon graduation, the loan is "forgiven" upon practice in qualified areas of North Carolina.
