

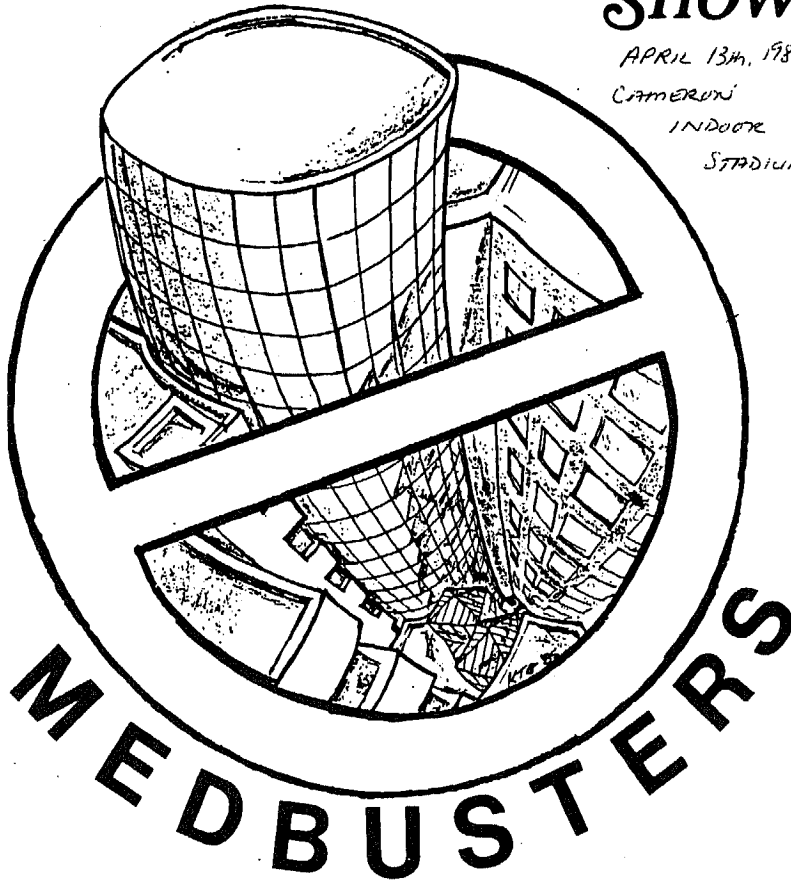

Emergency Medicine Residency

The American Board of Emergency Medicine has adopted the following motion:

That the Board increase the minimum time for graduate training in Emergency Medicine to 36 months after graduation from medical school and that such training be under the direction of a program recommended by the RRC for Emergency Medicine and approved by the ACGME. The effective date of this motion to be 7/1/87.

To be eligible for certification a resident entering the program on or after the implementation date (7/1/87) must complete the full 36 months.
